

TITLE VII SPECIAL ORDINANCES

CHAPTER 3 MINIMUM WAGE REQUIREMENTS

AN ORDINANCE REAFFIRMING THE MINIMUM WAGE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN IOWA CODE CHAPTER 91D AND REJECTING THE LINN COUNTY, IOWA ORDINANCE DEVIATING FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 91D OF THE 2015 CODE OF IOWA.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Linn County, Iowa has enacted a certain ordinance establishing a Linn County minimum wage;

WHEREAS, the minimum wage as established in the Linn County Ordinance, differs from the State of Iowa minimum wage, as set forth in Chapter 91D of the 2015 Code of Iowa;

WHEREAS, the Linn County minimum wage ordinance allows municipalities within Linn County to enact an ordinance rejecting the Linn County minimum wage standards as they differ from Chapter 91D, Code of Iowa, 2015; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council of Coggon, Iowa to follow the provisions of Chapter 91D of the 2015 Code of Iowa and not the minimum wage as set forth in the Linn County Minimum Wage Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF COGGON, IOWA, as follows:

SECTION I. Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to reaffirm the minimum wage requirements as set forth in Chapter 91D of the 2015 Code of Iowa;

SECTION II.

The Linn County Minimum wage adopted by the Linn County Board of Supervisors on or about the 12th day of September, 2016, is hereby rejected insofar as it raises the minimum wage requirement above those set by Chapter 91D of the 2015 Code of Iowa.

SECTION III. Repealer. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. Savings Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance, as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not be adjudged invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.

SECTION V. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effect after its final passage, approval, and posting as provided by law.
