5-2-1 PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to facilitate the enjoyment of park facilities by the general public by establishing rules and regulations governing the use of park facilities.

5-2-2 LITTERING. No person shall place, deposit or throw any waste, refuse, litter or foreign substance in any area or receptacle except those provided for that purpose

5-2-3 REMOVAL OF PLANTS. No person shall in any manner remove, destroy, injure or deface any tree, shrub, plant or flower, or the fruit thereof, or disturb or injure any structure or natural attraction except that, upon written permission of the Council, certain specimens may be removed for scientific purposes. This section shall not apply to activities of the Council or its officers or employees when caring for and managing the land.

5-2-4 FIRES. No fires shall be built, except in a place provided; therefore, and such fires shall be extinguished before leaving the area. Do not dump hot ashes on grass, plants or in trash barrels. You must bring your own firewood.

5-2-5 ROCKETS AND MODEL AIRPLANES. Use of liquid or solid fuel propelled rockets or model airplanes, with or without cables, is prohibited in all park areas except by written permission of the Park Board.

5-2-6 SOUND AMPLIFIERS. Use of a musical instrument with sound amplifier or sound equipment that includes amplifiers is prohibited in all park areas without written permission of the Park Board.

5-2-7 SALES AND SERVICES. No services shall be rendered for a fee or merchandise sold or made available or business of any kind transacted, or entertainment given for a fee in any park without first obtaining written permission from the Park Board.

5-2-8 USE OF DRIVES. No person shall drive any car, bicycle or other vehicles or ride or drive any horse in any portion of a park except upon the established drives or roadways therein or such other places as may be officially designated by the City. ATV's and off-road vehicles are not permitted on City park land. Snowmobiles are permitted only on designated marked trails.

5-2-9 KEG BEER. No person shall have keg beer in a City park unless such person has obtained approval from the City Council and has deposited a fifty dollar (\$50) refundable damage deposit with the City Clerk. No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on the playing field.

5-2-10 CAMPING AREAS. No person shall camp in any portion of a park except in portions prescribed or designated by the Council. Deposit required of twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) per towed or self-propelled camping unit.

5-2-11 CAMPING REFUSED. The City may refuse camping privileges or rescind any and all camping privileges for cause.

5-2-12 PAVILIONS. Reservations for pavilions are to be made with the City Clerk. A twenty-dollar (\$20.00) fee is required.

5-2-13 HOURS. All City parks shall be closed from eleven o'clock (11:00) p.m. to six o'clock (6:00) a.m. unless otherwise authorized by City Council.

5-2-14 PETS. Dogs and other pets shall be on a leash. Pet owner must clean up after.

5-2-15 NAILS AND STAPLES. No person shall use thumbtacks, pushpins, staples, nails or screws on picnic tables or the wood of picnic shelters. Tape is the only allowable fastening material to be used on tables and shelters. Violation can result in compensation for damages.

5-2-16 FIREARMS. No firearms, bows and arrows are permitted in City parks. No hunting or trapping is permitted in the City parks.

5-2-17 GLASS. No glass of any type is allowed in City parks.

5-2-18 OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE. Offensive language is not permitted in City parks.
